

Community Need

Data results provided by our school district partners^{*}, indicated that 53% of 3rd graders were not proficient in reading at the end of the 2023–2024 school year. Notable disparities remain between schools and subgroups of students, particularly African American and Hispanic subgroups.

The data shows that there is significant need for literacy intervention in the community.

Y Readers meets a range of student needs including literacy instruction, transportation, meals, enrichment programming, homework assistance, and social-emotional learning.

Overview

Y Readers provides afterschool tutoring and summer programming for K–3 students who are reading below grade level. The program aims to provide the additional support that students need to be proficient in reading by the end of 3rd grade.

Program instruction is lead by certified teachers and instructional assistants. Students receive 90 minutes of literacy as a part of afterschool tutoring and 2.5 hours during summer. Also during summer, students participate in a variety of enrichment activities, including physical education, art, and field trips.


Components










Students participating in Y Readers are assessed at the beginning and end of each program session using the Star Early Literacy assessment. Sample size includes students who had a pre- and post- assessment, and attended 80% of each program session (afterschool- 326 students, summer- 590 students).













SUMMER LITERACY INFUSION









Community Need

Summer learning loss research consistently shows that children in grades pre-k-5 lose 2-3 months of reading progress obtained during the school year, this is otherwise known as the "summer slide". Learning lost during summer can set children back at the beginning of the new school year, creating a cycle of catch-up that can impact long-term educational outcomes.

There are children in our community who do not have access to learning environments, literacy resources, or engagement opportunities to continue learning during the summer. Despite gains made during the school year, children will continue to experience reading loss without focused literacy support.

Overview

Summer Literacy Infusion (SLI) is a community program designed to mitigate the "summer slide" by engaging children in grades pre-k-5 in literacy over the summer.

We provide literacy-focused instruction and resources, free books for families, and incentives to promote home reading.

Literacy activities and games are integrated into traditional summer camp programming 4–5 days per week for 60 minutes per day. At Y centers, certified teachers serve as literacy instructors to plan and facilitate activities. At community camps, certified teachers serve as literacy coaches who support camp staff in implementing literacy practices.

Components



Community Partner Camps



Campers participating in Summer Literacy Infusion are assessed at the beginning and end of summer using DIBELS Nonsense Word Fluency, Oral Reading Fluency, or Letter Naming Fluency. Sample size includes campers who had a pre- and post-assessment and attended 75% of camp weeks, which was a total of 346 students this summer. Sample sizes are low due to movement of campers across different camps throughout the summer, which matches historical trends.
