SUMMER IN REVIEW



We had another incredible summer at Camp Harrison with 1,727 resident campers joining us for a total of 1,999 weeks of impact at Herring Ridge! The LIT program continues to be a lasting tradition, welcoming 44 teens this summer to learn, grow, and serve. Over 500 Bibles were requested by campers and staff, continuing the tradition of sharing our Christian principles with those who join us at Herring Ridge. This was our second summer of allowing campers to choose their own activities, providing campers with the opportunity to develop skills in their favorite areas and try new activities!

In the 2025 season, \$477,349 in scholarships opened the doors for campers of all backgrounds to join the Camp Harrison family, ensuring access to the magic of camp for 350 campers. This is a 283% increase in funds over the past three years, enabling an additional 243 campers to attend camp because of our incredibly generous donors who strengthen our community and impact generations of youth.

The staff team hit a record number in 2025, totaling over 125 staff! As you know, the people make the place and this team truly brought the impact. This was the second year welcoming staff from all over the world, with 32 staff from the UK, Mexico, and more, further diversifying and uniting our Camp Harrison family. The BEAR UP Award, formally known as the Spirit of Camp Award, was given to Trey Dean and Mary Taylor. Opening Campfire on Sundays still has so many of the traditions we love – singing about Beaver Sharks, meeting the Head Counselors, and closing out the night with Taps. And now, there is a new tradition at Camp Harrison... The Woods! Each staff member and camper is sorted into one of the Woods Houses for the week – Pine, Oak, or Maple – in which they compete during evening programs, meal times, and spirit competitions. Throughout the summer, points are tallied as the houses compete for the grand prize – The Herring Cup.

Once sorted into a Woods House, campers are there for life, as is their family line. As younger siblings grow old enough to come to camp and alumni who are part of The Woods send their campers,

their Woods legacy continues in the same house. The Summer 2025 Woods Herring Cup winners were PINE, and each member of The House of Pine was mailed an exclusive pin to commemorate their incredible victory!

Her favorite is closing campfire because you see the impact camp has each week on both campers and counselors! 
